just inside the school doors from the back parking lot in the farthest reaches from the school entrance there is a short corridor that leads to the hallway that houses washington river high school s two english learning classrooms these classrooms offer both safe sanctuary for the school s growing population of latinx students and a troublingly hidden space that allows most of the school and community to maintain the pretense of the generally prosperous white neighbor helping neighbor place of their myopic nostalgia this mayberry like imaginary excludes the divisive sociopolitical battles of the last decade that have earned washington river both local and national attention for a city ordinance that would fine landlords who rented to undocumented residents a de jure policy that became de facto racial profiling the english learning classrooms are thus sites for the work of learning english and other academic subjects alongside the more abstract but no less important work of constructing citizen identities in these spaces adolescent latinx newcomers negotiate and assert complicated claims about how they get to be of washington river high school the wider community of washington river and of the united states as established

residents and newcomers interact with each other or not in washington river they confront people who are linguistically culturally racially and socially different from themselves the polarized and contentious sociopolitical context of the united states in the wake of donald trump s election to the united states presidency in 2016 provides the backdrop to this nine chapter book the book centers the experiences of newcomer students as they construct citizen identities within the microcontext of their classroom and school and the macro context of a changing and polarized united states while this is an account of the local context of washington river the issues raised welcome unwelcome belonging and claiming rights are not particular to washington river as part of the changing sociocultural landscape of the midwestern united states in which historically distinct groups come together in common spaces washington river high school offers an example of the concurrently familiar and uncomfortable ways that new receiving communities in the new latino diaspora hamann harklau 2015 hamann wortham murillo 2002 host newcomers lamphere et al 1992 within the common and complex institution of high school

inclusive supervision in student affairs provides a new action oriented model that addresses what supervisors should do to create more inclusive environments for all staff and to help inform socially just practice grounded in theory and research and framed through the lens of continuous professional development and personal growth this book helps student affairs professionals at all levels develop effective leadership skills that demonstrate multicultural competence providing a conceptual model and self assessment tool to enhance professionals preparation for supervision this book also helps readers reflect upon their own capacity to enact an inclusive supervisory approach through the use of case studies and end of chapter questions

this unique collection of testimonials critical essays and first hand accounts demonstrates the significant contribution of campus service workers in supporting the retention and success of first generation college students using a freirean framework to ground individual stories the text identifies ways in which campus workers connect with students provide informal mentorship and offer culturally relevant support during students transition to college and beyond drawing on a range of interviews case studies and research studies emphasis is placed on the unique challenges faced by first generation and minority students such as cultural alienation imposter syndrome language barriers and financial insecurity ultimately the text dismantles notions of social hierarchies that separate workers and college students and encourages institutions to invest in these workers and their contribution to student well being and success this book will benefit researchers academics and educators with an interest in the higher education and student affair practice and higher education administration more broadly those specifically interested in multicultural education and the study of race and ethnicity within us higher educational contexts will also benefit from this book

more than a decade has passed since the first international conference of the learning sciences icls was held at northwestern university in 1991 the conference has now become an established place for researchers to gather the 2004 meeting is the first under the official sponsorship of the international society of the learning sciences isls the theme of this conference is embracing diversity in the learning sciences as a field the learning sciences have always drawn from a diverse set of disciplines to study learning in an array of settings psychology cognitive science anthropology and artificial intelligence have all contributed to the development of methodologies to study learning in schools museums and organizations as the field grows however it increasingly recognizes the challenges to studying and changing learning environments across levels in complex social systems this demands attention to new kinds of diversity in who what and how we study and to the issues raised to develop coherent accounts of how learning occurs ranging from schools to families and across all levels of formal schooling from pre school through higher education this ideology can be supported in a multitude of social contexts the papers in these conference proceedings respond to the call
