some people see religion and morality as undeniably connected others see them as irreconcilably separate paul diener s accessible new book looks at the connection between these two concepts and examines how various religious and philosophical systems understand morality

what do we talk about when we talk about religion is it an array of empirical facts about historical human civilizations or is religion what is in essence unpredictable perhaps the very emergence of the new in what ways are the legacies of religion its powers words things and gestures reconfiguring themselves as the elementary forms of life in the twenty first century given

the latin roots of the word religion and its historical christian uses what sense if any does it make to talk about religion in other traditions where might we look for common elements that would enable us to do so has religion as an overarching concept lost all its currency or does it ineluctably return sometimes in unexpected ways the moment we attempt to do without it this book explores the difficulties and double binds that arise when we ask what is religion offering a marvelously rich and diverse array of perspectives it begins the task of rethinking religion and religious studies in a contemporary world opening essays on the question what is religion are followed by clusters exploring the relationships among religion theology and philosophy and the links between religion politics and law pedagogy is the focus of the following section religion is then examined in particular contexts from classical times to the present pentacostal revival leading into an especially rich set of essays on religion materiality and mediatization the final section grapples with the ever changing forms that religion is taking such as spirituality movements and responses to the ecological crisis featuring the work of leading scholars from a wide array of disciplines traditions and cultures religion beyond a concept will help set the agenda for religious studies for years to come it is the first of five volumes in a collection entitled the future of the religious past the fruit of a major international research initiative funded by the netherlands organization for scientific research

and our future tell one universal story that begins with sacredness by embracing the wisdom of celtic christianity we can learn how to listen to the sacred and see the divine in all of creation and within each of us human beings are inherently spiritual creatures who intuitively see the sacred in nature and within one another but our cultures and at times even our faiths have made us forget what each of us already know deep in our souls but have learned to suppress sacred earth sacred soul offers a new spiritual foundation for our lives once centered on encouragement guidance and hope for creating a better world

pilgrimages can be analysed as acts of conflict such as the crusades or also as platforms for relationship building and rapprochement between religions with a set of contributions from leading experts in the field this book explores the concept of pilgrimage in christianity judaism and islam some specific examples of pilgrimages that helped to strengthen links between different religions or civilisations are explored ranging from europe to asia and from the middle ages to the twentieth century even though every pilgrimage that is investigated here has helped to link different worlds the case studies show that this relationship rarely led to a better in inter understanding nowadays peaceful coexistence seems to be its greatest achievement

placing native american spirituality in the context of the world's great religions sacred earth contrasts contemporary society s arrogant belief in its own power with native traditions of reverence for the earth this eye opening journey through the terrain of native american spirituality is an urgent call to rediscover and become firmly grounded on the sacred earth again
